OPEN FORMULARY VS. EXCLUSIONARY FORMULARY

Example 1: Bayer Contour® test strips

Total Care Plus (open formulary)

Covered

After Clinical Review

Pharmacist speaks with a doctor and learns member is using an insulin pump. Bayer Contour test strips are the only diabetic test strips compatible with the insulin pump. Changing the pump would not be cost effective.

EmpiRx Health Pharmacist reviews the case and ensures the patient is able to have their necessary test strips covered.

Total Care (exclusionary formulary)

Not Covered

Alternate Covered:

LifeScan OneTouch test strips

LifeScan OneTouch is not compatible with the insulin pump the member is using.

Member must pay full price for Bayer Contour test strips.

Example 2: Vraylar® 1.5mg capsules

Total Care Plus (open formulary)

Covered

After Clinical Review

Member has a mental health condition and was prescribed Vraylar 1.5mg capsules. The patient tried to use Olanzapine first, but did not fully control symptoms.

The member's provider submits documentation to EmpiRx Health for review for coverage of Vraylar 1.5mg capsules.

Total Care (exclusionary formulary)

Not Covered

Alternate Covered: Generics

Vraylar 1.5mg capsules are excluded from the formulary.

There are a few generic formulary alternatives the member would have to use or pay full price for Vraylar 1.5mg capsules.
